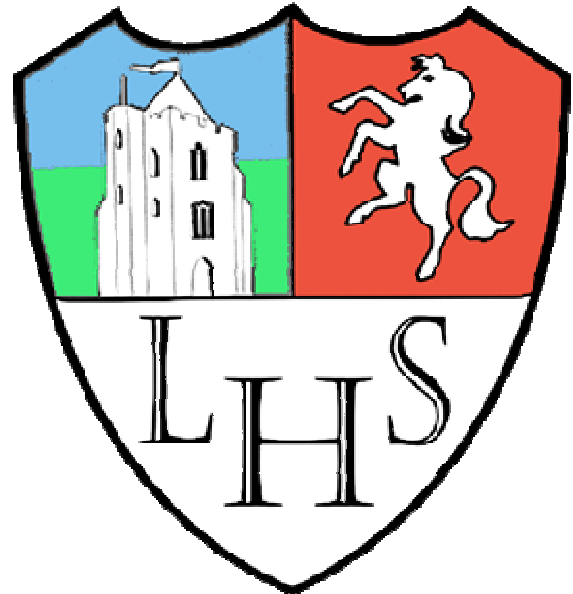
TRIPS & EVENTS
